Sage Grouse Pod – developed the Elko County Sagebrush Ecosystem Conservation Strategy. They have completed the Tuscarora and North Fork Watershed/ PMU Assessments. They were funded by Questions 1 funds. They are seeking founding for the Gollaher, O’Neal and Snake PMUs.

Heritage Pod – meet with the watershed/ PMU neighbors to share natural history and heritage storied. They generate projects to enrich the appreciation of the history of Northeastern Nevada.

Science Pod – provides educational forums such as wild horses and recreation.

Fire Ecology Pod – works on the Tuscarora hoary cress demonstration plot. They coordinate the many entities in the use of prescribed fires and preventing catastrophic wildfires.

Recreation Pod – partner on creating the Secret-Lamoille Trail. They work to ensure diverse public land recreation opportunities.

SWEATCo – works on Public Lands Day and National Trails Day projects. They are people working together, sweating together, for the good of the land and community.

Who Are We?

The Northeastern Nevada Stewardship Group (NNSG) started in 1998 as an outgrowth of community partnership training sponsored by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). That training emphasized building individual and community capacity for sustainable resources and economics.

The founders of NNSG embraced the principles of that training and established NNSG to "work to build trust among diverse citizenry to ensure sustainable resource use." The organization's approach is science-based, but values-driven, achieving solutions supported by both resource users and land management agencies. Members are diverse – anyone with an interest in Nevada's lifestyles, landscapes, and culture.

Our volunteer organization is funded by grants, private and corporate donations, membership dues, and funds from the BLM and U.S. Forest Service.
